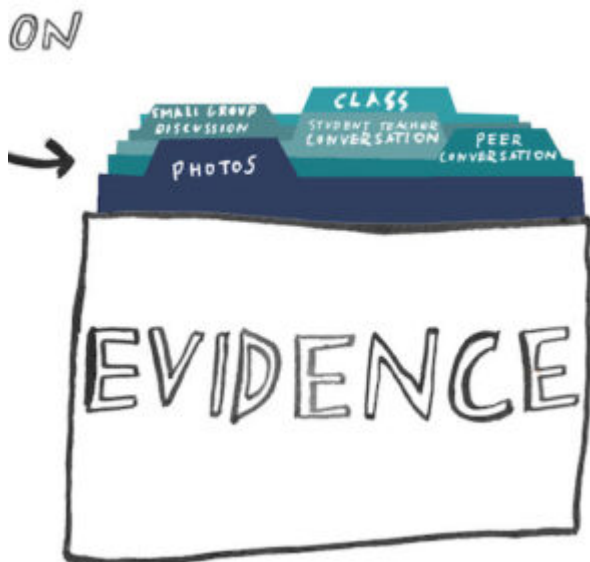
The creative ego is a fragile beast. When we place ourselves in some kind of position of authority over another person's self-expression, we should always tread very carefully.

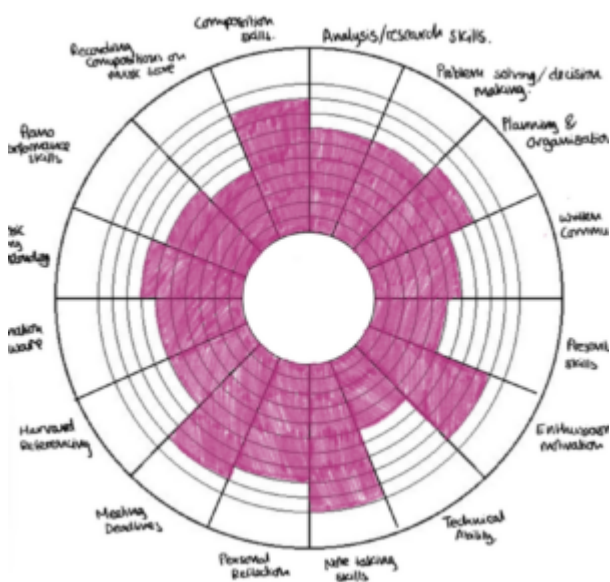

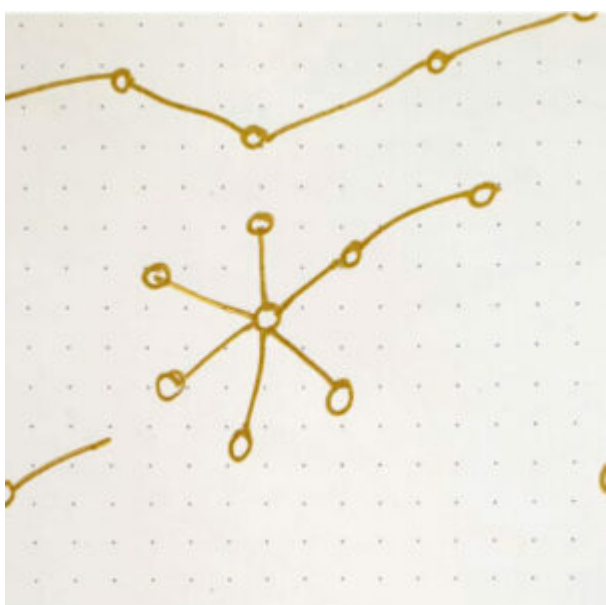
