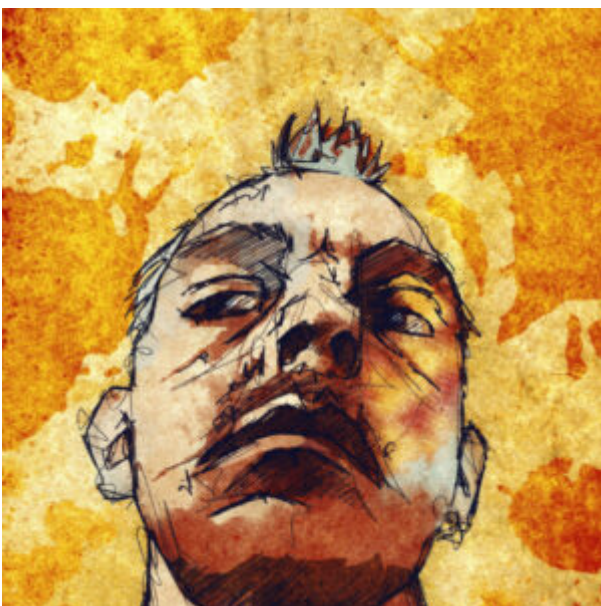

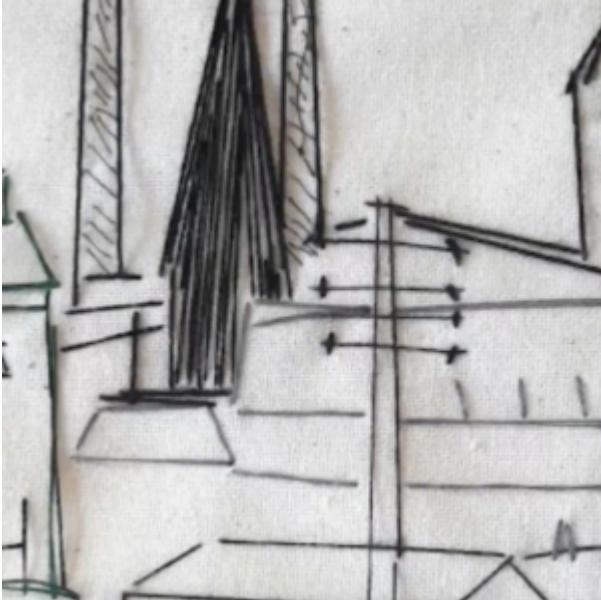


_Mike inspires children to explore mark making and symbolism to create highly personal

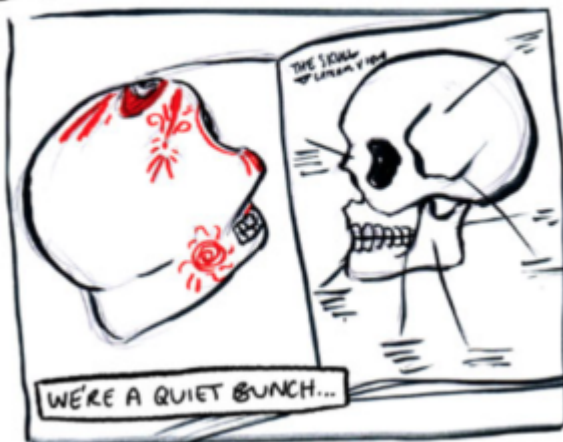
