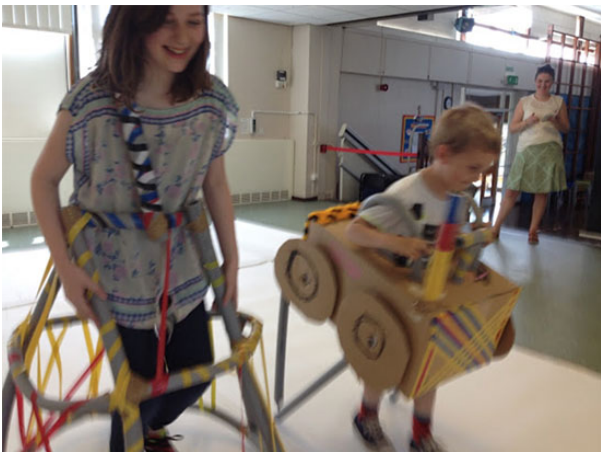


Art Rooms in KS1 & KS2 Schools

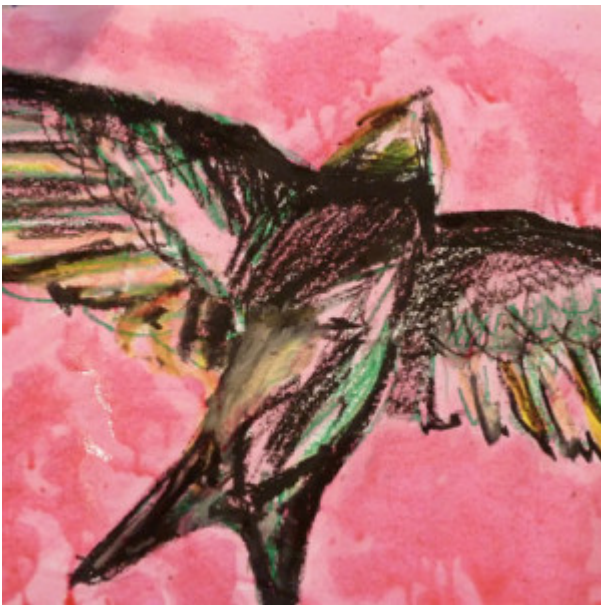

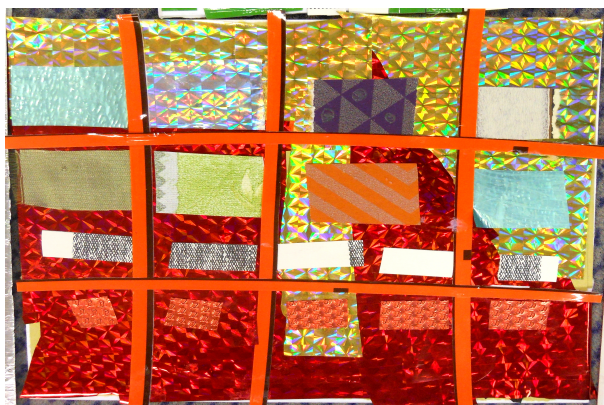

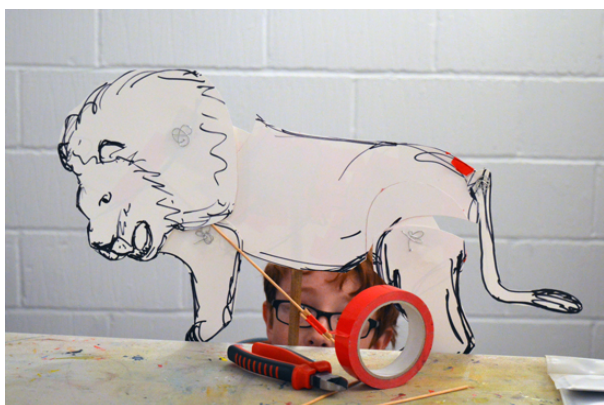

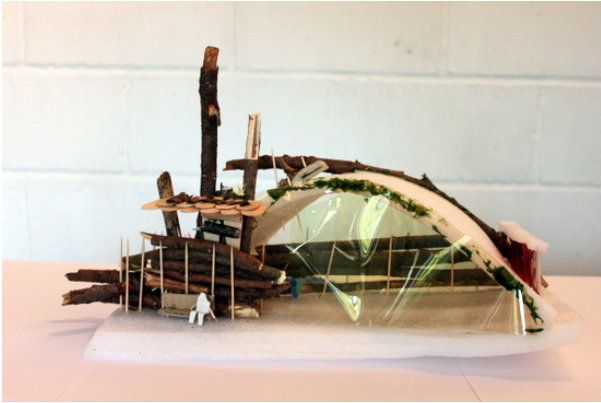

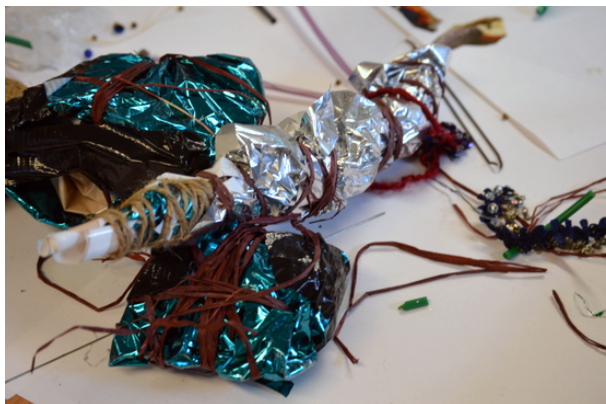
