

The “Split” AccessArt Primary Art Curriculum

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The AccessArt Split Primary Art Curriculum has been devised for schools who currently teach art half the time (usually splitting the timetable with DT).

Please note that AccessArt provides only the Art element, not the DT element.

We recommend that when you are teaching DT, you put in place a practice of drawing exercises, even if it is just ten minutes, once or twice a week. [Explore some drawing exercises you can use here.](#)

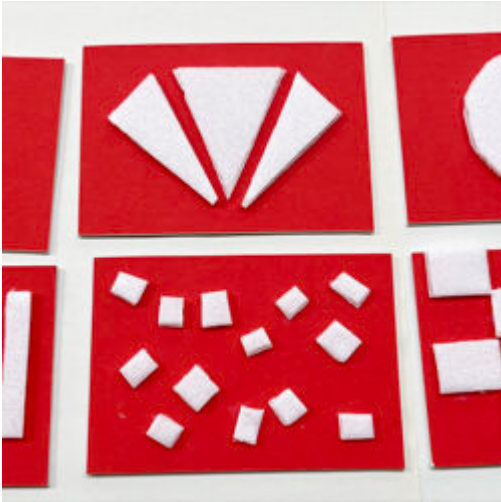

Using drawing, collage and mark-making to explore spirals.

Explore simple ways to make a print. Use line, shape, colour and texture to explore pattern, sequencing and symmetry. [See the Pathway](#)

Inspired by Flora & Fauna

Sculptural project beginning with making drawings from observation, exploring media, and transforming the drawings from 2D to 3D to make a bird. [See the Pathway](#)

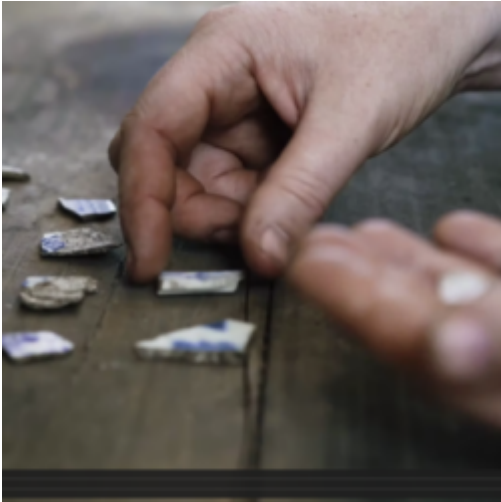
Drawing Exercises

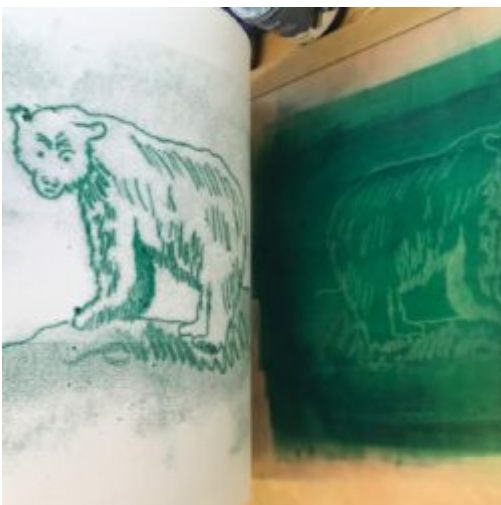
Autumn Term
