
Jason Line


Explore Colour Mixing

Explore the basics of colour mixing for younger students with this "Exploring Colour" resource by Hester Berry.

Find out about colour mixing progression from

Powder Paint to Gouache and Acrylic paint with the "Progressing from powder paint to Acrylic" resource.

Enable students to take real ownership of their colour mixing journey by focusing on mixing with Cyan, Magenta and Yellow.



Explore Composition

Take inspiration from "Jan Davidsz de Heem's Flowers in a Glass Jar" workshop and explore colour and composition.

Scaffold "Still Life Inspired by Cezanne" to encourage students to create and photograph their own still life compositions using household objects. Although this activity is modelled with Early Years it can be adapted across all ages.



Explore Creating Still Life Paintings

Explore form and shadow with our "See Three

Shapes" warm up exercise.

Find out how you can create "still life collages" with this resource- perfect for playing with composition. Or bring your still life's to 3D with our "graphic inky still life" resource.

Use and adapt "Drawing Tulips Big" resource to encourage students to play with scale and put their personalities into their paintings.

Or take inspiration from our "Introduction to Ink via Still Life" and experiment with varied mark making, washes and beautiful, translucent effects. Follow on by creating fun seasonal still life compositions inspired by a "Gothic Still Life" workshop.
