
How Do We Adapt our Art Teaching to Include Children with Specific Educational Needs?

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
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
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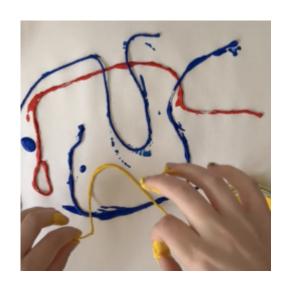
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Making Musical Instruments


