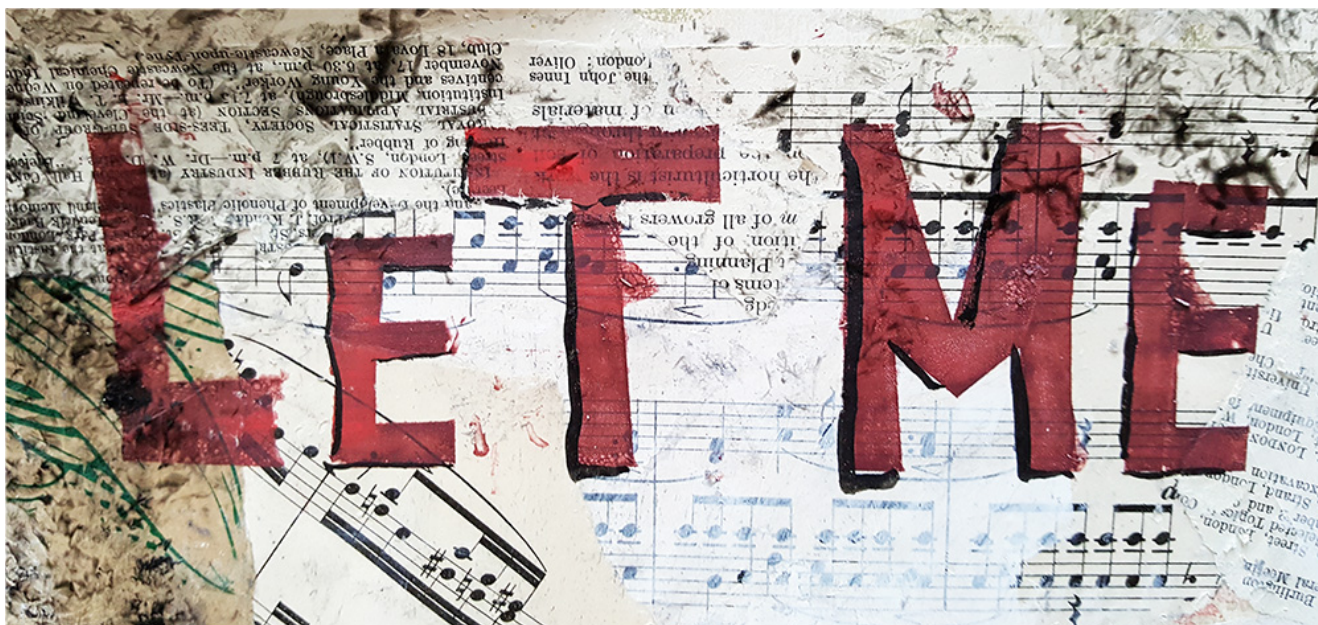


# Teenagers Make Propaganda Art Inspired by Shepard Fairey
