

Transformation for Ages 11 to 16

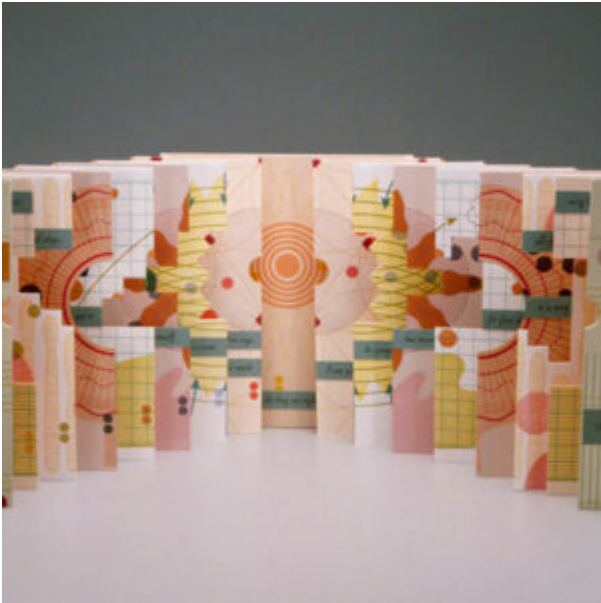

Pathway: How can I create sculpture inspired by books and storytelling?



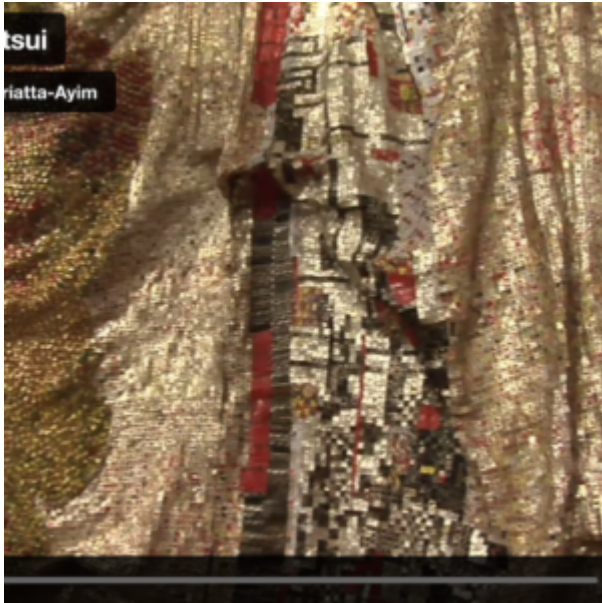
