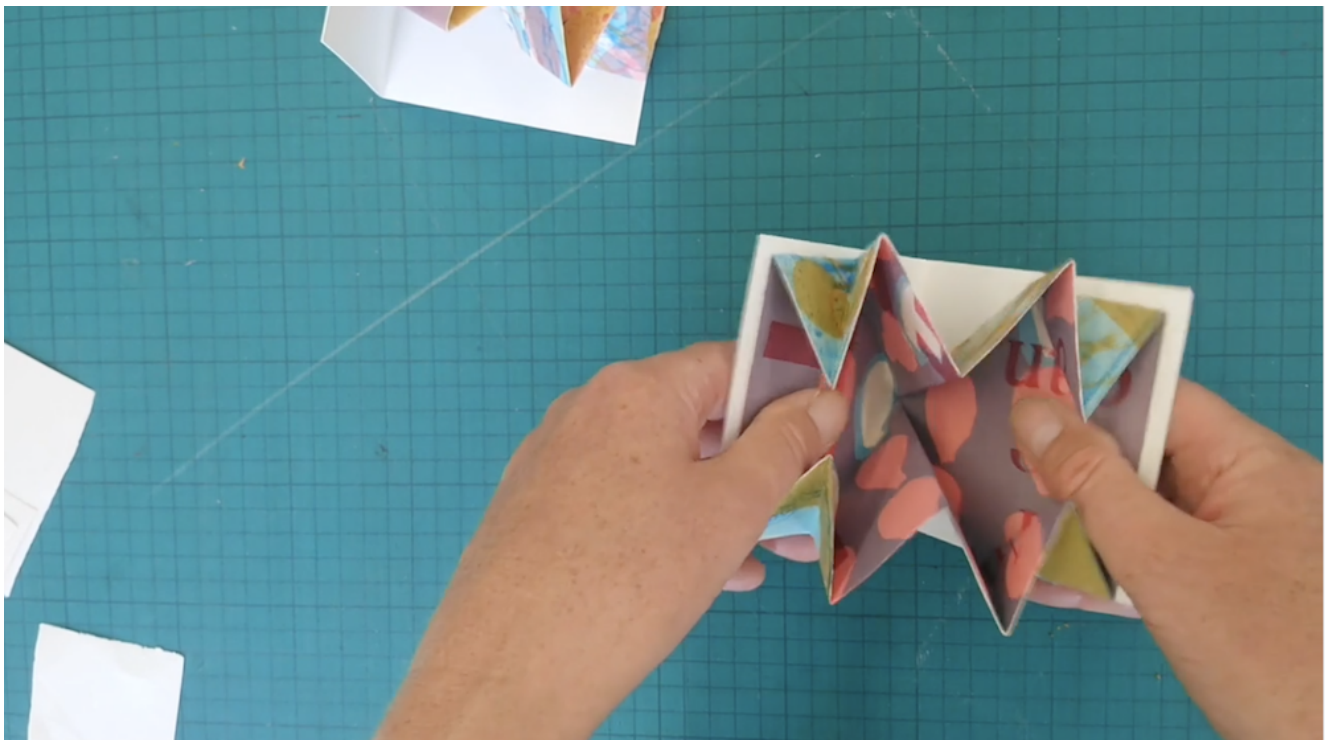


Turkish Map Fold

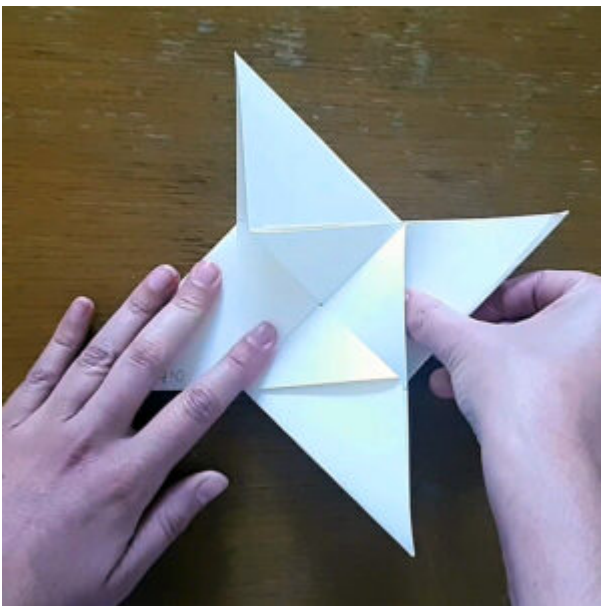
What We Like About This
